문화공간 & 청소년센터

문화공간 & 청소년센터는 대지 내에 특이하게 배치되어 있으면서 주위와 절묘하게 조화를 이룬다. 새로운 지평선을 만들어 내는 긴 목재 지붕은 마치 정원에 핀 커다란 조각품을 배어낸 실루엣과 같은 느낌이다. 건축물은 이러한 방식을 상징성과 현대적인 특성을 취한다.

객은 처마 밑을 산책하면서 하나가 아닌 두 장소를 발견하게 된다. 중앙의 덮개에서 출발하여 한쪽으로는 활동실로 전개되고, 다른 쪽으로는 모든 종류의 활동을 제공하는 청소년센터로 전개된다. 그곳은 충분한 수용력을 지니며 자유롭게 놀아 줄 여유 공간이 있다. 넓은 처마는 그들을 제공하는 한편 규칙적인 간격으로 된 창문은 자연광을 받아들인다.

부위 표지판의 규격화는 자연적 요소와 건축적 요소가 연결되도록 기능하는 중추를 만들어낸다. 이러한 중첩성은 반드시 내·외부가 동일한 조건 하에 배치되어 향후 사용자들이 자연과 조화될 수 있는 공간을 제공한다.

Though unusually set within the site, the building subtly blends in with the

surroundings. With its long timber roof, it creates a new horizon, a cut-out silhouette that forms a huge sculpture on the scale of the landscape. In this way, the project takes on a symbolic, contemporary dimension.


Walking about under the roof, the visitor discovers not one, but two places. Starting out from a central covered plaza, the building spreads out on one side into an activity room, and on the other into a youth club offering all kinds of activities. There is plenty of room to move around, with extra spaces to be used freely. And regularly-spaced door and window openings let in natural daylight, with broad eaves providing shade.


'Pixelisation' of the openings and the signs creates super impositions that supply a link between the natural and constructed elements. So this cultural venue ensures that indoors and outdoors are placed on the same footing, and hence future users with nature.


